Withdraw from the Trans-Pacific Partnership Instruct the Secretary of Commerce to identify every trade violation that hurts the American workforce and use any legal tool to end abuses Renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA), including ending Mexico's tariff and VAT on American imports. If other nations are not in agreement on renegotiation, the US will withdraw from the partnership Instruct the Secretary of the Treasury to label China as a currency manipulator Instruct the U.S. Trade Representative to bring cases against China for trade violations, in the U.S. and at the WTO Appoint tough new trade negotiators to prevent American jobs from being outsourced overseas Trump's trade policy can best be summed up in declaring American Economic Independence and an end to globalization
